Fifteen years ago when the Jankovich Company leased the fuel tanks at 10th Avenue marine Terminal and invested in barges and infrastructure, there was one, soon to be bankrupt cruise ship operating out of San Diego. In 2008, there were 259 cruise ship port calls, with 212 being turnarounds (passengers embarking and disembarking). These turnaround ships create millions of dollars of revenue for hotels, restaurants, shops, and tourist attractions.

There is one major reason the cruise lines are home porting their ships in San Diego. And that is the availability of fuel for their ships. Without the fuel tanks, pipelines, and barges located at 10th Avenue Marine Terminal, the cruise lines would not be home porting ships and scheduling turnarounds in San Diego. And all those millions of passenger dollars would be spent elsewhere.

The Jankovich Company and 10th Avenue Marine Terminal contribute greatly to downtown business and city revenue.
